Ministry Spotlight Sacred Arts Collective

Our church has been selected to participate in the Sacred Arts Collective through Candler School of Theology!

The Sacred Arts Collective is a new initiative at Candler School of Theology focused on deeply engaging congregations in the Atlanta area to imagine how to nurture and grow the faith of children through the integration of the arts in worship. Through this effort the hope is to fashion creative learning environments that inspire leaders and families to fully embrace the arts to engage in sensory-rich worship across generations. The Rev. Dr. Khalia J. Williams, Associate Dean of Worship and Spiritual Formation, leads the initiative.

Upon completion of our cohort year, our congregational teams will have the opportunity to apply for an Artist-in-Residence grant for up to \$20,000. A Congregational Artist-in-Residence will be hired for an identified period to work closely with the children's ministry and worship teams to increase the inclusion of children in worship through creative arts.



Prayers of Lament A form of prayer that is an honest expression of our sorrows to God.

We learn about prayers of lament from the Psalms.

- 1. You are invited to read Psalm 13, 22, and/or 88. (The Psalms starts on page 489 of your pew bible)
- 2. Reflection questions: What jumped out at you? How did the psalmist address God? What did the psalmist cry out? How did the psalmist appeal to God? How does the psalmist trust God? How can you relate to the psalmist?

Writing your own prayers of lament...

- A. Turn to God (An address to God)
- B. Cry Out Your Complaint (Name the problem being seen or experienced and express it vividly before God)
- C. Appeal for God to Hear and Respond (Know of God's faithfulness to hear us and meet us in the depths of our cries)
- D. Confess Your Trust (Acknowledge that God is trustworthy)

...Amen
