Prayer for Remembering

Our Generosity Story

Stewardship—"Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same." *Luke 3:11*

We all have a generosity story. It might not be giving our second shirt to another, but it could be donating our time and resources to a local food pantry. It could be contributing to our congregational youth so they can experience celebrating and strengthening their faith with their peers at the Montreat Middle School Conference. It could be putting your offering in the collection plate at worship that allows us to hire and support our amazing FPC staff that keep our church running.

Generosity makes an impact. Whether we are aware of it or not, generosity changes the lives of others for the better and is a tool that allows us to love our neighbor as ourselves, as we are called to do from Jesus.

The best stories captivate and transform us – they change how we live. This stewardship season, we invite you to remember, release, reimagine, and restore your generosity story so that we can all be a part of the story God is calling us to.

You can find Pledge Cards and our Time & Talent survey available in the Narthex, at fpccov.org/stewardship and in the e-news. We ask that they be returned by Commitment Sunday on October 26th by placing them in the offering plate, mailing or bringing them to the office, or emailing them to peni@fpccov.org.

We fully understand that financial promises are often just guesses right now, and you are always free to adjust your pledge at any time if you find your circumstances change. However, having an estimate of what we expect our financial resources to be allows us to create a responsible and reasonable budget and an action plan for our ministries in 2026.

Please join us in creating a generosity story for FPC that will help us return our tithes and talents to God and our neighbors.

Worship Art—This stewardship season, we invite you to remember, release, reimagine, and restore your generosity stories so that we can write the one God is begging us to live into. Perhaps you have not before experienced art and stewardship combined. Maybe you've even thought of these subject matters as incongruous or unrelated. However, stewardship, like art-making, is a spiritual practice.

Throughout the stewardship season we will create simple art elements through worship (no "art skills" required!) which will be pieced together to make a mandala mosaic banner to illustrate our generosity to the Lord, the church, and to each other. This project is designed to help us as a church family tangibly mark our progress throughout our stewardship season. Interweaving art elements into our worship we will create a mandala mosaic.

What is a mandala? Meaning "circle" in Sanskrit, a mandala is a geometric, circular design used in Buddhist and Hindu traditions for meditation and prayer. Often, the design of the mandala represents a cosmos or universe and is used for spiritual transformation and healing. The mandala template used in this project nods to this Eastern tradition. The imagery within the rings of the mandala correspond to the scriptures in our four-weeks-long stewardship series, "Our Generosity Story." Our hope that through our creative process in bringing this mandala to life it will be a gift to our church family!

Cover Art—Today's worship guide cover art is a digital painting inspired by Exodus 16:1-18 titled *Enough* by Hannah Garrity. The following is the artist's statement on the piece:

We have enough... I have been contemplating this phrase for the last two years. We recently moved. In the process, we downsized. How could so many things that I remembered paying money for now become so irrelevant that I would choose to put them in the trash? My Honda Accord had to hold our bags, the inflatable bed, the two

children, and me. Sitting on my front stoop, I slowly realized that I had to send everything else to the dump. I had two hours.

For \$50/load, a junk mover would take everything left in the house in the back of a blue pickup truck. Four loads. I had always contributed one trash can per week to the landfill. This was different. It was jarring. I began to feel lighter, but heavier at the same time. Why had I purchased all of these things? Enough is better than more, more, more.

In this painting, I have overlaid my empty hand with sets of circles. The guillochéstyle patterning is used by treasuries all over the world to secure paper currency by making it too intricate to counterfeit. Here, guilloché circles represent my deeply personal relationship with the money that supports our lives. Some money falls past my hand, some into my hand. Moses advises the people: take only what you need, one omer each. In this piece, the idea of enough money is layered with the idea of enough sustenance through manna. The manna is portrayed by another set of circles, reminiscent of the wafers that are used in some traditions as Communion bread. Enough. Thank you, God, for providing enough, that I would take what I need.

Throughout the pews you will find a selection of "offering cards" which we invite you to use to share how you intend to be a good steward this week. *Connect* with us as a newcomer by sharing about yourself or your family. *Pray* with us by offering a prayer which will be shared with the Pastors. *Serve* with us by telling us how you will use your time and talent this week. Or *Give* with us by placing either a card to represent your online gift or physical cash or check offering. These offering cards are an invitation to generosity!

A word from our youth Audrey Fullerton about her time on the 2025 mission trip:

I thought the mission trip would be staying in a church the whole day in worship with only breaks for meals. Instead, the food was way better, and we went to kitchens and food pantries and worked. I learned how to make chicken salad. There were a lot of things for everyone to do, even kids, and make a difference. I enjoyed playing kickball with the other kids at Thornwell Children's Home.

I think I made the most difference at the food pantry at Montmorenci UMC because there were so many people who came through for food, and many of them were immigrants. My job there was to work at a table where people could select food, but also to remind them to leave enough for the next family. I liked giving candy to the kids who came through the line.

During the trip I got to know Mrs. Julie better. I helped her get up the stairs and learned that it can be hard for her to get around in some places. I realized that in a lot of places where I can get around easily, some other people can't. Before the trip I didn't know her very well, but now I feel like I know her better. She is really nice.

I saw God in the people that worked or volunteered at each place. They seemed so enthusiastic to help people and to get other people to help.




