All Saints' Day—All Saints' Day is a time to rejoice in all who through the ages have faithfully served the Lord. The day reminds us that we are part of one continuing, living communion of saints. It is a time to claim our kinship with the "glorious company of apostles ... the noble fellowship of prophets ... the white-robed army of martyrs" (Te Deum). It is a time to express our gratitude for all who in ages of darkness kept the faith, for those who have take the gospel to the ends of the earth, for prophetic voices who have called the church to be faithful in life and service, for all who have witnessed to God's justice and peace in every nation.—An excerpt from the Companion to the Book of Common Worship (Geneva Press, 2003, 150-151)

Worship Art—Today's cover art is by Nettie Jane Kenney, featuring a twenty-block "Housetop" variation quilt, created circa 1960.

"In the rural community of Gee's Bend, Alabama, African American women have been making quilts for generations. Taught by their mothers, grandmothers, and aunts, these women use scraps of old overalls, aprons, bleached cornmeal sacks - anything they can find. The mere scraps are then transformed into spectacular works of art, each one displaying a unique pattern with vibrant color and complex geometric composition." —excerpt from Susan Goldman Rubin's The Quilts of Gee's Bend.

The love and artistry of quilting are often inherited traditions, passed tenderly from one generation to the next. Many learned to stitch at young ages, sitting beside mothers and grandmothers, absorbing not only the techniques of quilting but also the patience, creativity, and care it embodies. These quilts once warmed their families—both literally and emotionally—becoming symbols of connection, hope, sacrifice, and love.

Now, decades later, these same quilts are celebrated as works of art. In 2002, pieces like Kenney's were featured in an exhibition at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, honoring the enduring legacy of quilting and the stories and traditions stitched into every piece.

Like the women of Gee's Bend inheriting the passion of quilting, what is something you have inherited?

Worship Practices

Baptism—Baptism is one of two sacraments practiced by Presbyterians; Communion is the other. The act of baptism is deceptively simple—but in a handful of water, there is a deep well of mystery and meaning.

In baptism, we are called to a new way of life as Christ's disciples, sharing the good news of the gospel with all the world. Presbyterians describe baptism as a sign and seal of the covenant of grace made by God through Jesus and extended to us. In baptism, God claims us as beloved children and members of Christ's body, the church, washing us clean from sin as we renounce the power of evil and seek the will and way of God.

All four Gospels report the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan River (Matthew 3:13–17; Mark 1:9–11; Luke 3:21–22; John 1:29–34). When we are baptized with water in the name of the Trinity, we share in Christ's own baptism.

Presbyterians celebrate baptism as a communal act of public worship! Today we, as the body of Christ, will say "YES" to walking alongside Daniel Atkins as we seek to nurture and love him as his family of faith!

We invite you to speak to Pastors Neeley or Erin if you are interested in baptism for yourself or your child.
