

Worship Practices

Confirmation—The word confirm, from the Latin confirmare, means "to strengthen." At Confirmation, the Holy Spirit and the church's prayers strengthen those who are being confirmed. This strengthening includes preparing individuals who were baptized in infancy to 1) profess their personal faith and the faith of the church and 2) declare their intent to take part actively and responsibly in the church's worship and mission. For those not baptized as children, Confirmation includes both Baptism and a profession of faith.

Confirmation is an act of covenant renewal that includes 3 parties:

God confirms a youth's baptismal identity as a child of God, whether baptism occurred in childhood or will happen at Confirmation worship

The youth confirms their faith in Jesus and the teachings of the church

The congregation confirms the youth's spiritual gifts for ministry & active church membership

Baptism—Baptism is one of two sacraments practiced by Presbyterians; Communion is the other. The act of baptism is deceptively simple—but in a handful of water, there is a deep well of mystery and meaning.

In baptism, we are called to a new way of life as Christ's disciples, sharing the good news of the gospel with all the world. Presbyterians describe baptism as a sign and seal of the covenant of grace made by God through Jesus and extended to us.

In baptism, God claims us as beloved children and members of Christ's body, the church, washing us clean from sin as we renounce the power of evil and seek the will and way of God.

All four Gospels report the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan River (Matthew 3:13–17; Mark 1:9–11; Luke 3:21–22; John 1:29–34). When we are baptized with water in the name of the Trinity, we share in Christ's own baptism.

Presbyterians celebrate baptism as a communal act of public worship! Today we, as the body of Christ, will say "YES" to walking alongside Beatrice, Greer, Lily, and Ruby as we seek to nurture and love them as their family of faith!

We invite you to speak to Pastor Neeley if you are interested in baptism for yourself or your child.


