### Light in the Darkness

A reading from Psalm 42:8:

"By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life."

This candle represents our suffering and the suffering of the world.

In the light of God's love, we claim God's gift of lament.

We recognize our wounds and cry out to God.

We accept God's invitation to express every feeling and question.

### My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?

Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer;

and by night, but find no rest. (Psalm 22:1-2)

(Pause for one minute of stillness)

This candle represents our suffering and the suffering of the world.

In the light of God's love, we claim God's gift of courage.

Courage to be honest, to seek help, to comfort one another.

Courage to dare to love and dream again.

The Lord is my strength and my shield; in him my heart trusts;

so I am helped, and my heart exults,

and with my song I give thanks to him. (Psalm 28:7)

(Pause for one minute of stillness)

This candle represents our suffering and the suffering of the world.

In the light of God's love, we claim God's gift of hope.

God is good. God is strong. God is near,

leading us to a day without tears and pain, without sin and death.

Healing and deliverance are coming; if not now, then on that day.

By awesome deeds you answer us with deliverance, O God of our salvation; you are the hope of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest seas.

(Psalm 65:5)

## Naming Our Sorrows and Bringing Our Pain to God

During this time you are invited to write your burdens and sorrows on the piece of paper provided for you.

After writing and reflecting, you are invited to bring your paper forward and place them in the bowls. Come cast your burden on the Lord. You will watch as the paper dissolves.

Following that, you are invited to come receive anointing with oil, a symbol of God's intimate presence. These prayerful activities are optional. Feel free to stay in your seat if you prefer.
