

Advent Notes

What Do You Fear? Advent Series—Our 2025 Advent series "What Do You Fear?: Insisting on Hope This Advent" was created by the creative team at Sanctified Art. The following is their message on the series:

This Advent series takes seriously the angels' message and trusts that Christ's birth truly is good news of great joy for all people. We have looked at the fear and terror looming in the background during the time of King Herod and considered the fears we hold now. Fear can divide and paralyze us and even be used as a tool for oppression. But what if we formed a different relationship with fear? Can we acknowledge fear without letting it rule us? Might we catalyze our fears into love and action? What if naming our fears helps us see more clearly how God is breaking in and where God is at work?

As we've journeyed through this season, our hope become gritty and resilient. May we remember: hope that trembles is still hope. Let us insist on hope and trust that good news is greater than fear.

Worship Art—Today's worship guide cover art is a cut paper and paint collage by Cody F. Miller titled "A Quiet Morning" which was used in the 2021-2022 Presbyterian Women/ Horizons Bible Study "What My Grandmothers Taught Me" to accompany the lesson on Mary. The following is an excerpt of the artist's statement for the "What My Grandmothers Taught Me" series:

I think grace is a tricky word. I read about it, experienced it, and heard testimonials. It is a deep transforming kindness that is given often when I least deserve it. There's always this tension between the way I think it should look and the way it actually comes to me. Often, I show people on a journey; their painful moments force them into a kind of exile where everything is foreign and disorienting.

I work with cut paper and paint because I enjoy the interplay of the known and unknown. For the known, I work out many variations of a sketch until the design I'm looking for is finally realized. The unknown comes from my files full of patterns and objects that wait to find a new home. I am fascinated when I find that some odd cut-out worked better than my original intention.

My predominate focus on women from the Bible began when my mother could no longer care for me and I had to leave our home. The rich tapestry of women that God has brought into my life to be my mothers, sisters, and friends has been overwhelming. There are so many women that can so easily get lost in scripture, yet as we take a closer look, we see with clarity the monumental force of their actions. I've seen a fierce, compassionate, creative, and gentle love, and the tone of God's voice has been transformed in the journey.
